A SAFE RIDE FOR THE FAMILY



Sgt. Charles served almost 11 years in the U S Army, first as a chaplain assistant and then a cavalry scout. During his time in the Army, Charles was deployed three times (including tours in Iraq and Kuwait), where he was severely injured in an IED explosion. Upon his return home, he also suffered a small stroke. Permanently disabled, Charles worked hard to recover his strength and help his wife raise their four young children.

When the COVID-19 pandemic started, the family suffered increased financial stress, so Charles reached out to SALUTE, INC. for assistance. Fortunately, SALUTE was able to provide the family with **payments on their car loans**. This assistance secured transportation for the family, easing their financial worries and ensuring a safe ride to therapy, school and the grocery store.



RENEWED

Army Specialist Noah proudly served for four years during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Returning home, he married and settled down as a family man, working for the US Postal Service. Eight years after leaving the service, Noah realized that his lingering PTSD was greatly impacting his daily life. Despite his responsibilities as a husband, father and breadwinner. Noah and his wife knew he had to seek mental health treatment. He located a VA program that targeted PTSD, and enrolled, taking time off from his job and leaving his wife and five kids at home without his paycheck. The intensive inpatient program provided great relief to Noah, but the family fell behind on utilities and rent. Referred by the VA, SALUTE was able to help Noah's family with rent and utility payments. Noah is now looking forward to returning to his family and job, renewed by the mental health therapy he received.

The PORTRAIT OF A SOLDIER REMEMBRANCE CEREMONY on

September 11. It was a day we will never forget. The ceremony included a stirring prelude by the 484th Army Quintet to open the event, presentation of Colors by the 2/24 Marines Color Guard, a welcome from Arlington Heights Mayor and U.S. Army veteran Tom Hayes, student essays by Kelsey Neary and RJ Gamble, reading of the names of Illinois Fallen Heroes, and the playing of Taps. After the ceremony we enjoyed the opening of the Portrait of a Soldier display at the Arlington Heights Memorial Library. The display, championed early on by former Illinois Governor Pat Quinn, is centered on a moving collection of portraits of over 300 U.S. service men and women from Illinois who died in service to their country since 9/11.

Recently, WiGiv took time to assist U.S. Army veteran Colton with much needed projects in his yard. Colton served in the Army for almost 6 years with the 10th Mountain Division Infantry 222 before receiving an Honorable Medical Discharge due to injuries sustained in Afghanistan. The WiGiv team cut grass, applied weed killer, weeded all planting areas, removed rotted landscape timbers, trimmed decorative trees and overgrown bushes, and cleared brush. This is another example of connecting a community to welcome Colton to his new home.

Throughout 2021, TEAM SALUTE's Charity Athletes and Volunteers eagerly made the transition from "virtual" to "hybrid" to "in-person" fundraising events. Pictured below are a few of the highlights.

In early spring, SALUTE was the beneficiary of donated funds through the Wisconsin Marathon in Kenosha. Though we were not yet able to gather for our annual Memorial Weekend 5K, many SALUTE supporters **Carried on the Tradition** by entering the virtual run/walk, donating household necessities for the Lovell VA Health Care Center, and purchasing hand painted patriotic planters.

By summer, over 100 charity runners had registered with TEAM SALUTE for the Bank of America Chicago Marathon, many of whom had maintained their commitment from the cancelled 2020 race. After 18 weeks of training, the long awaited emergence from shutdown was celebrated over 26.2 miles of city streets. SALUTE's biggest fundraiser of the year was BACK!
